Polwhele House is located just outside of Truro and educates children aged 3 to 13, including all of Truro Cathedral's boy choristers.

Community spirit is at the heart of Polwhele House's ethos, and is a part of the school's curriculum and learning environment.

Alex McCullough, Headmaster at Polwhele House, said:

"Community is a huge part of life here at Polwhele House and the children regularly take part in events such as the Truro City of Lights festivities and visit Truro Day Centre to sing to the elderly every year. We also teach the children about various roles within the community through events like our 'People Who Help Us Day', making this an important feature of their learning experiences.
